

Sermon Outline

<u>Focus:</u> In Luke 4 and 1 John 3, we see that empowering the poor is both a rallying cry to love others "in action and in truth" and a gospel mandate. We are called to step into the brokenness of others and bring freedom and restoration, just as Christ Jesus did for us.

I. Poverty

II. Luke 4; 1 John 3

Rallying cry for God's kingdom – loving others with "action and truth"

How to empower the poor:

1. We are called to serve others not save others

Isaiah 61: Good news to the poor

Redefinition of identity

Christ and Christ alone is the Savior – not us

2. Relate to people, not rescue people

Helping others experience the freedom and restoration that only a relationship with Jesus can bring

Craig Groeschel: "Those struggling are not projects to help, but people to love."

Not transactional ministry; it's relational ministry

3. Empowerment reflects the heart of the gospel

We were spiritually poor, but Jesus proclaimed good news to us!

Empowering the poor is a gospel mandate!
