GENERAL CLOTHING GUIDELINES:

It is important to remember that when you are on the field ministering, you are representing God, Adventures In Missions, and local missionaries. Modesty is the key to all clothing you decide to bring with you. If you are questioning whether or not you should bring it, then leave it at home. Here are a few guidelines for clothing choices:

- 1. Bring something modest to sleep in.
- 2. No short, tight, or clingy clothing is permitted.

3. Sleeveless shirts and tank tops that are 2" wide are permitted on girls. No sleeveless shirt of any form is permitted for guys.

4. If you cannot raise your arms above your head or touch your toes without showing your stomach or lower back, leave it at home.

- 5. Shorts must come to the top of the knee. Capris and gaucho pants are great options.
- 6. Skirts and dresses should be below or close to the knee.

7. Make sure clothes are not stained and/or torn (except for clothes for painting/heavy manual labor). You do not have to wear your best clothing, but make yourselves presentable. It may be offensive to the locals if you look sloppy
