

Sermon Outline

<u>Focus:</u> Abiding in Jesus is the key to a life of spiritual growth, strength, and fruitfulness. Just as branches cannot bear fruit apart from the vine, we cannot thrive apart from Christ. When we remain in Him, He nourishes us, transforms us, and produces in us the lasting fruit of His Spirit that impacts the world around us.

I. I Am – the True Vine

The 1% phone battery problem

Jesus is our "power source"

II. Jesus is the only source for a vibrant spiritual life

Israel – described as God's vineyard – set apart to display His glory

Psalm 80:8-9; Isaiah 5:1-7; Jeremiah 2:21; Ezekiel 15

As the true vine, Jesus declares:

True source of spiritual life

Fulfillment of God's promises

The only path to true fruitfulness

Are you abiding in Jesus?

"Abide" - active dependance

Jesus doesn't give a task list – he gives relationship

Remain, dwell, stay connected – relational term

IV. Fruitfulness is Evidence of a Life Abiding in Christ

Fruitfulness – a sign of spiritual vitality

Galatians 5:22-23 – not singular – one cohesive work produced by the Spirit

Spiritual fruit grows slowly, and pruning is required

Sermon Outline

<u>Focus:</u> When we keep in connection with God, we draw strength and produce fruit. There are times when our lives are pruned in order to become more fruitful. In those pruning times, we have the choice to change and grow or shrivel and die.

I) Pruning my oak leaf hydrangea

Knowing when to cut back for growth

Am I being cut down to become more fruitful or cut off because I am fruitless?

II) Jesus and His Farewell Discourse (John 14-16)

Preparing his disciples for what is to come. Abide in Me.

The Imagery of the Vineyard in Israel (Isaiah, Jeremiah 2, Psalm 80, Hosea 10)

Jesus is the True Vine: Connected to the source of life

III) The Nature of a Grape Vine:

The Vine needs pruning to produce good fruit.

The farther away from main stock the less fruitful it becomes

If the branches are disconnected from source they die

Picking up sticks with Adelynn

The best vineyards in the world exist in some of the most challenging soil

Yancey "Seasons of dryness make the roots run deep, strengthening the vine for whatever the future holds"

IV) "Abiding" is the key to spiritual growth

Jesus doesn't give a task list – he gives relationship

Abiding in the Lord during Pruning season

The point of staying connected is not to exist but to bear excellent fruit.

Blackaby: "You can respond to the silence of God in two ways. One response is for you to go into depression, a sense of guilt, and self-condemnation. The other response is for you to have an expectation that God is about to bring you into a deeper knowledge of Himself."
