Focus: In Deuteronomy 6, we see that we are found in God's love and formed into Christ's image. We all are shaped by something, but the greatest life we can live is a life shaped by God as we are formed into the image of Christ.

I. What's forming you?

Deuteronomy 6:4-9

Found in God's love and formed by his truth

II. You have been found in God's love

The gospel is that God found us when we were lost

1 John 4:19 "We love because He first loved us."

We are made worthy by his love – stepping into a lifelong relationship with Him Not a halfway commitment, but an all-in surrender (all your heart, soul, & strength) Do you love him back?

III. Formed into Christ's image
